

YOUR ROOFING PROJECT PREPARATION GUIDE:

The entire Northeast team wants to do their part to ensure your project goes as smoothly as possible. That includes minimizing disruption to your home and your household. We'll work together with you to achieve that!

Key steps for homeowners to prepare for the project:

Maintain Communication with Northeast:

- Your Northeast project manager will walk you through the entire project timeline.
- We will ensure you are updated about your project's process when and how it is most convenient for you. Let us know your preference!

Prepare Your Property Outside:



PERIMETER

- Remove all toys, tools, or bicycles from the entire perimeter of your home, including porches, if possible.
- Protect any outdoor furniture, grills, planters, and other items.
- Clear walks, driveways, decks, and other outside areas adjacent to the house. Plan to move your vehicles out of the driveway.



ROOF

- Remove satellites, antennas, or weathervanes from your roof.



LIVE MATERIAL

- Protect your plants, shrubs, and flowers if they are close to the house.

Prepare Your Property Inside:



THE ATTIC

- Remove all valuable items from the attic or cover them carefully with plastic sheeting or tarps to protect from dust.



WALL VIBRATIONS

- Although it is unlikely, it is possible that the roof installation could cause wall vibrations. Remove framed pictures or mirrors hung on the walls of your upper floor just in case. This also applies to glass in sconces or lighting fixtures on the upper floor.



CLEAR SKYLIGHT AREAS

- Remove any items that might be under the skylights in case our team needs access to the skylight through your home.

Additional Considerations:



SAFEGUARD CHILDREN & PETS

- You may prefer to arrange for children or pets to be away during the project as the roofing process will create some noise that could disturb them.
- Have your children wear shoes outside the house during and after the work. Thousands of nails are used to install a new roof.
- Cut your grass short before the project begins, as nails can be more easily missed among long grass.



WATCH THE WEATHER

- Northeast will always reschedule a project if the forecast calls for rain, because any water or moisture during the re-roofing process could undermine the integrity of the roof.
- If unexpected rain occurs, the team will protect the roof with waterproof material until it is appropriate to continue the job.



TIP OFF THE NEIGHBORS

- We suggest letting your neighbors know when the work will happen, so they can plan for any noise or disruption. They'll appreciate the courtesy and will likely return the favor should they undertake a large home project.
